- Legal Protections: In Canada, protection of birds is divided between federal and provincial governments; including the Migratory Birds Convention Act; Section 32(1) of the Canadian Species at Risk Act (SARA); and, Section 14 of the Ontario Environmental Protection Act (EPA) whereby it is an offence to kill or injure birds by reflective light/windows on buildings.
