

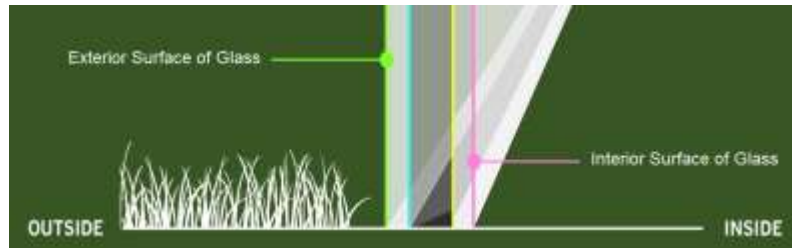


Window Visual Markers

FLAP CANADA To effectively reduce bird collisions with your windows, you will need to make your glass look like a barrier for birds to avoid by using visual markers. A visual marker is a pattern of any shape that is applied to or hung in front of your window. Have fun. Be creative, treat your windows like a canvas. Please follow these 5 guidelines when applying markers:

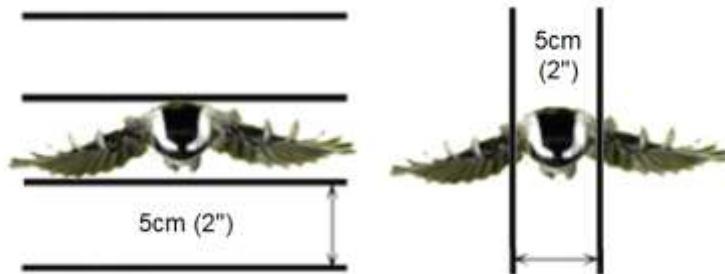
1. SPACING

Separate markers by spaces no more than 5 x 5 cm (2 X 2 inches).



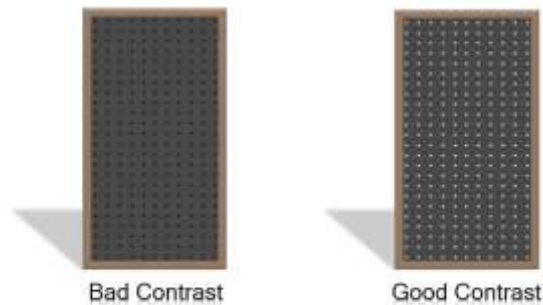
2. SURFACE

Apply markers to the exterior surface of glass.



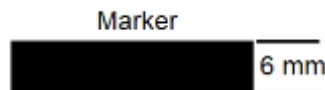
3. CONTRAST

Make sure the markers stand out in contrast to the transparent or reflective glass surface under varying daylight conditions.



4. SIZE

A marker should be no less than 6 mm (1/4 inch) in diameter.



5. COVERAGE

Cover the entire glass surface.
